SURGICAL PRACTICE SERVICES

- All areas of general surgery,
- Upper and Lower GI Endoscopies, Polypectomy, Screening
- Laparoscopy. (Did you know? The hospital recently obtained state of the art high definition endoscopy and laparoscopy equipment.)
- Skin Cancers especially involving the head, neck and face.
- Hernias (including children). Inguinal hernias are all done as outpatient with short recovery time. Most are back to activities of daily living the next day.
- Vascular Access Procedures: Ports including new power ports that can be used to infuse contrast for CT's. PICC lines and Triple Lumen Catheters.
- Ventral and Umbilical Hernias (including children)
- Hand Conditions: Carpal Tunnel Syndrome, Trigger Fingers, Ganglions, Dupuytren's Contracture.
- All bothersome lumps and bumps: moles, lipomas, and inclusion cysts
- Wound Care, Venous Ulcers and Chronic Deep Venous Insufficiency
- Elective Sterilization: male and female
- Musculoskeletal complaints
